

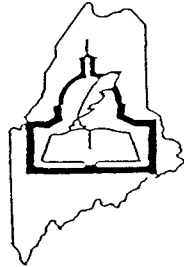

SUMMARY

This bill was carried over from the First Regular Session. The bill replaces the existing correctional advisory body with a larger commission and gives it greater responsibilities and staff to assist it in carrying out the responsibilities.

Committee Amendment "B" reduces the number of members on the commission, makes staff positions optional, reduces the commission's duties, removes the appropriation section and adds a fiscal note which indicates that costs will be absorbed within existing budgets.

SUMMARY

This bill amends the existing correctional program improvement fund to include funding for private provider programs that target offenders who would otherwise be incarcerated but who pose no threat to the safety of the community.

Committee Amendment "A" replaces the bill with language establishing a pilot community sentencing options unit within the Division of Probation and Parole. Officers working within the unit offer recommendations to judges for community sentencing options within presentence investigation reports for all felony offenders. The amendment also provides funds for expanded community-based services for adult committed offenders.

The bill was carried over from the First Regular Session. The Committee reviewed its actions on the bill and voted it out "ONTP."

SUMMARY

This bill was carried over from the First Regular Session. The bill increases the length of sentences which must be served in county jails from 9 months to 1 year. The bill also prohibits using the County Correctional Improvement Account for capital improvements.
