SUMMARY

This bill, as amended, establishes criteria for the adoption of a development moratorium by the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission that are the equivalent of the criteria now in effect for municipalities. It also establishes criteria for the adoption of a moratorium by an organized town or plantation seeking to remove itself from the jurisdiction of the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission.

The amendment (S-49) clarifies both the definition of moratorium and the intent of the moratorium provision to cover specific portions of the unorganized territories rather than the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission's entire area. It also clarifies that municipal officers of an organized town or plantation which have petitioned to remove the town or plantation from the jurisdiction of the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission may act in place of the commission to extend the moratorium.

SUMMARY

This bill proposed to eliminate the Board of Environmental Protection's authority to require an applicant for a site location permit to correct preexisting road conditions which are not located on the site of the development and are outside the control of the applicant. Under this bill, the applicant would have been required to make adequate provisions for traffic only on the site of the development.

SUMMARY

This bill would have established a municipally-enforced requirement for the installation of garbage disposal units in all new residential units and substantially renovated units. The Department of Human Services would have been charged with developing implementing regulations. The committee voted not to pass the bill.
