#### SUMMARY

This resolve was carried over from 1st Regular Session. It sought to establish a study of the Public Utilities Commission rule concerning interexchange competition and service access charges among telephone service providers. The resolve would have suspended the rule pending completion of the study by the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities. Of particular concern was the effect the rule would have on private companies which purchase various reduced rate intra-state services, such as WATTS lines, and sell (or resell) access to those services to smaller consumers.

It sought to establish a statutory formula which the Public Utilities Commission would be required to use to determine rates for pole attachments by cable television systems if the cable TV system and the public utility or utilities owning the poles could not agree on a rate.

### **SUMMARY**

This bill was carried over from 1st Regular Session. It sought to allow for approval for expansion of service territory by specific areas, instead of by municipal boundaries; to give the Public Utilities Commission jurisdiction over approval of a telephone company's construction of facilities that are not designed to serve end use customers, e.g. toll trunks and other long distance facilities through utilities service territories or outside their own service territories generally; and to give the Public Utilities Commission jurisdiction over disputes between 2 utilities about territory or customers.
