All Adopted Amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action is listed to the right of the title. If final House and Senate action differ, both are listed. Committee Reports and Floor Action are abbreviated as follows:

# LD 570 An Act Authorizing Sale of Liquor Outside of Exclusive Territory

The terms of the credit must require payment within 30 days of receipt of malt liquor or wine. Wholesalers are obligated to report to the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages retailers who failed to pay an outstanding balance within 30 days. Failure to make this report is made a civil violation for which a fine of up to \$1000 may be adjudged. municipality must have established by ordinance a hearing procedure for parking violations under which the parking violation was finally adjudicated or the violation must have been finally adjudicated by a court and the fine or penalty imposed must have been unpaid for 30 days before the municipality may notify the Secretary of State that the violator's license should be suspended.

#### SUMMARY

This bill allows voters to vote a straight party ticket by checking a "big box" on a ballot bearing the name of a political party. The bill directs the Secretary of State to amend the ballot labels to reflect this voting option.

#### SUMMARY

This bill establishes a system for requiring non-binding mediation of disputes between mobile home park owners and their tenants. The bill provides that a tenants' organization or a committee of no less than 5 tenants can require a park owner to participate in mediation of disputes involving matters enumerated in the bill. Those matters include rent increases, evictions due to renovations of the park and changes in park rules. The bill provides for a stay of implementation of disputed changes, and precludes filing of any court action relating to the dispute, until completion of the mediation process.

Committee Amendment "A" provides that the Commission on Manufactured Housing, established by the 113th Legislature, will consider the mediation issues raised by the bill and submit its recommendations to the Legal Affairs Committee in its report due during the Second Regular Session of the 114th Legislature.
