An Act Regulating the Sale of Grave Markers by Funeral Establishments

SUMMARY

This bill prohibits persons licensed to provide funeral services from selling grave stones or markers.

Committee Amendment "A" requires that whenever funeral establishments sell grave markers they adhere to the pricing disclosures required by the Federal Trade Commission in its "Funeral Industry Practices" which requires that the marker be included in the list of goods and services provided to the consumer and requires that the consumer be told that purchase of the marker is optional.

Senate Amendment "A" to Committee Amendment "A" clarifies that the Federal Trade Commission sale requirements do not apply to the sale of grave markers when the sale, or offer to sell, is made after the funeral has been completed.

An Act to Make Surveyors Liable for Their Surveying Errors

SUMMARY

The practice of land surveying is regulated by a state board and surveyors are required to be registered based on certain standards of education and experience. The board may revoke this registration based on fraud, negligence or incompetence. This bill allows the board to find a surveyor guilty of a civil violation for these infractions and impose a penalty of 3 times the damage caused by the surveyor's action. The bill also changes the composition of the board from 5 surveyors and one member of the public to 3 surveyors and 4 members of the public.

SUMMARY

This bill authorizes the Board of Accountancy to promulgate rules requiring quality reviews as a condition to obtaining permits or renewals of permits to practice public accountancy in the State.
