The bill listed a set of factors that a court must consider in setting or reviewing alimony awards.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-276) replaced the text of the bill. It revises several factors listed, and delays the effective date until January 1, 1990.

SUMMARY

The bill increases the residence exemption from attachment to \$60,000 for elderly and disabled persons.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-303) revises the definition of "disabled" and provides that the increased exemption does not apply to tort actions involving anything other than ordinary negligence.
