The bill extended the 3-year statute of limitations in medical malpractice cases to 5 years. (Carried over from the First Regular Session with the other medical malpractice bills.)

SUMMARY

The original bill established a comprehensive set of laws prohibiting certain types of computer-related crimes and providing penalties. The bill was similar to bills introduced in past sessions. (Carried over from the First Regular Session.)

Committee Amendment "A" (H-748) replaced the bill. It defines significant terms and creates the crimes of criminal invasion of computer privacy and aggravated criminal invasion of computer privacy.

SUMMARY

The original bill revised the notice provisions in the Probate Code to ensure that reasonably ascertainable creditors received notice in compliance with the U.S. Supreme Court decision in <u>Tulsa</u> <u>Professional Collection Services v. Pope</u>. (Carried over from the First Regular Session.)

Committee Amendment "A" (H-758) replaced the bill. It incorporates the amendments to the Uniform Commercial Code adopted by the National Conference of Uniform Law Commissioners in 1989. The amendment covers notice by personal representatives, the barring of claims, and immunity for personal representatives, and sets an outside limit for filing claims of 9 months after death. Uniform Probate Code comments are included.
