SUMMARY

This bill will bring the State Board of Registration for Land Surveyors, renamed the Board of Licensure for Professional Surveyors, under the jurisdiction of the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation. The bill redefines and clarifies the purpose of the board, establishes a uniform procedure for the processing of complaints, updates provisions to regulate the profession of professional surveying as it exists today and increases the maximum fee that professional surveyors can be charged for licensure from \$60 to \$100 annually.

Committee Amendment "A" reduces requirements for licensure when compared with the original bill, clarifies the definition of the practice of land surveying by including in the definition the knowledge of rules and evidence of boundary laws and allows anyone who files an application prior to the effective date of the legislation to qualify under existing law, even though the application may not be considered until after the new law becomes effective.

House Amendment "A" to Committee Amendment "A" corrects a technical error.

House Amendment "B" to Committee Amendment "A" adds a section requiring the Board of Licensure for Professional Land Surveyors to conduct its disciplinary proceedings according to the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375.
