SUMMARY

The bill created a Patient's Compensation Fund which would in effect insure health care providers meeting the criteria for participation in the Fund. (Carried over from the First Regular Session with the other medical malpractice bills.) Pursuant to Joint Rule 13, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives required the bill to be reported out of Committee without a Committee Report.

House Amendment "A" (H-1105) revised discovery procedures in medical malpractice cases, modified the collateral source rule to allow the court to reduce a medical malpractice award by collateral source payments, set a \$250,000 cap with a Consumer Price Index escalator on noneconomic damages in medical malpractice cases, and established the Medical Liability Demonstration Project and the Rural Medical Access Program. (Not adopted)

SUMMARY

The bill required the disposal of fetal remains to be by burial or cremation. (Carried over from the First Regular Session.) The committee determined that rules on the disposal of biomedical waste adopted by the BEP adequately cover the issue.
