SUMMARY

In October 1986, Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act of 1986 (SARA), Title III, Public Law 99-499, mandated specific actions concerning designated extremely hazardous substances. However, this requirement was enacted by Congress without financial support. This program, which is designed to improve the environmental health and safety of Maine citizens, requires staff support to implement, monitor and manage this program. A fee schedule was proposed under this bill to be developed by the Director of the Maine Emergency Management Agency to make this program self-sufficient.

This bill was incorporated into LD 1475.

This bill, as amended (S-70), transfers responsibility for the dam safety inspection program from the Department of Environmental Protection to the Maine Emergency Management Agency. The bill was amended (S-408) to remove the appropriation sections as these funds were included in the Part II budget bill (PL 1989, c. 501).
