LD 908 proposed to create a Workers' Compensation Logging Industry Fund established by a 1% assessment on all employers' and insurers' paid workers' compensation losses. The Fund would be used to reimburse employers in the logging industry for any expense of a workers' compensation claim over \$25,000.

LD 914 proposed to increase the family allowance under the unemployment compensation law from \$5 per week for each eligible dependent to \$5 per day.

Committee Amendment "A" (S-194) made the bill an emergency, effective July 2, 1989; reduced the increase to \$10 per week per eligible dependent; and added a fiscal note.
