SUMMARY

This bill would require payment of general assistance rent vouchers within 7 days of issuance.

It would also prohibit discrimination against multi-unit residential dwellings by refusing to provide services or requiring supplemental fees for such services as trash collection and snow removal.

SUMMARY

This bill would enable the State to provide training and technical assistance as well as initial program funding for as many as 20 community or regional cardiovascular prevention and education programs. The types of community organizations which could establish these prevention programs include hospitals, community health agencies, nursing agencies, community action programs, health centers and local health departments. A match of \$1 local funds for every \$1 of state funds will be expected of each program.

This bill removes an October 1, 1989 sunset provision in the law prohibiting an employer from requiring HIV testing of employees and applicants for employment in health care facilities except as a bona fide occupational qualification.
