LD 1037 proposed to lengthen the term of office for Senators elected to the Maine Senate. In addition, the terms would be staggered. Beginning in 1992, Senators elected in the odd numbered districts would be elected to 4 year terms. In 1994, Senators from the even numbered districts would be elected to 4 year terms.

LD 1054 proposed to create a 9 member commission to study the feasibility of a southern Maine regional jetport and report its findings to the Second Regular Session of the 114th Legislature.

The bill was amended by the Committee to create a 21 member advisory committee to advise the Department of Transportation in updating the State Aviation Systems Plan. The Department of Transportation would study the current aviation system, the future needs of an effective aviation system over the next 20 years, and other related issues. The Department would report its findings and recommendations to the First Regular Session of the 115th Legislature.

LD 1076 repealed the Municipal Records Board and the County Records Board and combined the functions into a single Local Government Records Board. The new board has jurisdiction over the disposition of all local records, including those of school districts and special purpose districts which have not been required previously to identify and retain permanently valuable records.
