## SUMMARY

The original bill required the State Forensic Service to do all examinations, added additional mental and emotional conditions permitting examination and made several other clarifications regarding the State Forensic Service. (Carried over from the First Regular Session.)

Committee Amendment "A" (H-744) amends the bill to allow independent psychiatrists and licensed clinical psychologists to perform examinations, allow examiners to report if a defendant can be competent to stand trial, retain current law regarding examination of juveniles, and provide for a professional education program for examiners.
