All Adopted Amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action is listed to the right of the title. If final House and Senate action differ, both are listed. Committee Reports and Floor Action are abbreviated as follows:

OTP	Ought to Pass
OTP-ND	Ought to Pass in New Draft
OTP-ND-NT	Ought to Pass in New Draft, New Title
OTP-A	Ought to Pass as Amended
ONTP	Ought Not to Pass
LVWD	Leave to Withdraw

SUMMARY

The bill would make tampering with a juror a Class B crime, except where the underlying crime is murder or a Class A crime, in which case tampering with a juror or a victim is a Class A crime.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-302) reduced the crime by one class.
