

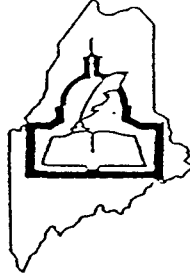

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The summaries are arranged by LD number for each committee.

All Adopted Amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action is listed to the right of the title. If final House and Senate action differ, both are listed. Committee Reports and Floor Action are abbreviated as follows:

OTP-A	Ought to Pass as Amended

SUMMARY

This bill exempts aquaculture activities from the duplicate review under the protection of natural resources laws (38 MRSA, chapter 3, article 5-A) and the aquaculture lease laws, (12 MRSA, section 6072). Aquaculture activities currently regulated by both laws will be exempted from the Natural Resources Protection Act. Those activities which are only ancillary to aquaculture will still require environmental review under the Natural Resources Protection Act.

SUMMARY

This bill, as enacted, authorizes the Board of Harbor Commissioners for Portland Harbor authority to set service fees for recreational wharfs, limits the service fees to a maximum of \$50 and adds 2 new members to the Board of Harbor Commission for Portland Harbor, one of whom shall be a holder of a commercial fishing license and one of whom shall be a representative of commercial, marine or shipping interests. An appeal procedure from the service fee is provided for affected wharf users.

SUMMARY

This bill, as enacted, requires the Commissioner of Marine Resources to promulgate rules to allow the removal of abandoned lobster gear. It also prohibits anyone other than the licensed owner, or someone authorized in writing by the licensed owner, from fishing with that gear.
