### SUMMARY

This bill would have imposed an additional civil penalty on the operators of hydropower projects whose violations of the law result in fish kills.

The committee amendment broadens the scope of the original bill to make it a violation for improper operation of a fishway which results in a fish kill. The departments of Marine Resources and Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall jointly make rules to define fish kill. The penalty shall equal the value of the fish killed but not exceed \$10,000 each day the violation continues.

The amendment also adds a fiscal note.

## SUMMARY

This resolve would have directed the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities to study public acquisition of recreation rights to lakefront property owned by water companies.

This resolve was withdrawn and replaced by a Joint order to establish a select committee to study the acquisition of recreation rights. The members of the committee represented the Joint Standing Committees on Utilities, Fisheries and Wildlife, and Energy and Natural Resources. The resolve was not funded.
