All Adopted Amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action is listed to the right of the title. Committee Reports and Floor Action are abbreviated as follows:

SUMMARY

LD 1168 proposed comprehensive amendments to the education funding formula. In the 1st Regular Session, the Committee voted to recommend passage of portions of this bill, with some changes. The bill was carried over by the Appropriations Committee and referred back to the Education Committee in January. The committee in the Second Regular Session also voted to recommend passage of the bill with the same amendment as in the 1st Regular Session. As amended, the bill would have required full state funding of all new mandates for the duration of the mandate, required updating of special education costs to the year of allocation, provided a low-income student adjustment, and repealed the section that reduces state subsidy for units that receive federal impact aid.

LD 1226 An Act to Assure Access to Nutrition Programs for Kindergarten and Part-day Students**INDEF PP**

SUMMARY

This bill, which was carried over by the Education Committee, would have required public schools in which at least 40% of the students are eligible for free or reduced price meals to provide kindergarten and other part-day students a meal that meets the requirements of the National Breakfast Program.

The Committee Amendment (H-736) added a fiscal note and an appropriation for \$48,500 for FY 91. House Amendment "B" (H-781) amends the Committee Amendment to require schools to charge fees for the meals covered in the bill where permitted to do so under federal law and to use the funds to offset some of the costs of the bill. The House Amendment also reduced the appropriation to \$9,768 and required the State to continue to pay the 100% of the costs incurred by local units to implement this bill.

Although the bill was indefinitely postponed, parallel provisions were included in the supplemental Budget Bill, PL c. 875, part G-1.

LD 1244 An Act Relating to School Construction**LV/WD**
