An Act to Clarify the Definition of Solid Waste Disposal Facility

SUMMARY

This would have amended the definition of the term "disposal" in the solid waste law (38 MRSA c.13) with the effect of including incinerators and other trash-to-energy projects under the definition of solid waste disposal facilities. This concept was incorporated in LD 1431, as amended.

SUMMARY

The original bill prohibited recreational use of ATV's in state parks. The committee amendment (H-227) prohibited all-terrain vehicles from lands under the care of the Bureau of Public Lands except under specific conditions. It also prohibited all-terrain vehicle trails from any state park unless they are specifically approved by the Legislature.

Section 3 of the amendment required the Bureau of Public Lands to evaluate its land holdings for the appropriateness of developing recreational trails for all-terrain vehicles. Section 4 allowed the Bureau of Parks and Recreation to conduct a one-year experimental program for a recreational trail for all-terrain vehicles in Mount Blue State Park.

The bill was indefinitely postponed on the floor of the House and the Senate concurred.

SUMMARY

This bill would have required random monitoring of surface waters for water quality violations. Violations posing a public health risk were to be reported to the Department of Human Services and to local health officials. The sponsor withdrew the bill.
