SUMMARY

This bill established a study to design a system of ecological reserves in the state and provided funding. The parameters of the study were defined and the State Planning Office was directed to form a steering committee to advise it on the conduct of the study. The bill was indefinitely postponed but its text was included in PL 1989, c. 501, the Part II budget.

SUMMARY

This bill proposed to provide the Maine Forest Service with vital information relating to the location of commercial forest products harvesting activities within the State. It also would have provided for annual reports of commercial forest products sold by the forest landowner or processed by processors within the State. In addition, this bill would have provided for penalties for failure to notify and to submit required reports to the Maine Forest Service.

An amended version of these provisions was included in LD 429.
