LD 1247 proposed to increase funding for the Maine Training Initiative Program, correct references to the amended Federal Job Training Partnership Act, expand eligibility for MTI services to persons who were marginally employed and ensure that support services available under the MTI program were not viewed as an entitlement.

Committee Amendment "A" (S-310) made technical drafting corrections, deleted the non-entitlement language and established a uniform procedure for job training system participants to appeal program decisions.

House Amendment "A" to Committee Amendment "A" (H-698) removed the appropriation from the LD.

LD 1251 proposed to authorize the Workers' Compensation Commission's Appellate Division to hear appeals filed by employees on factual decisions of an individual commissioner if the decision would result in "significant injustice" to the injured employee.

SUMMARY

LD 1283 proposed to prevent employers from requiring employees to work on a Sunday and further required twice the normal pay for any work performed by an employee on a Sunday.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-484) completely replaced the LD. It deleted the double-pay provision, limited the bill's application to manufacturing employers with over 250 employees and added a fiscal note.
