### SUMMARY

This bill provides for funds to increase the State's contribution for the group accident, sickness or health insurance on behalf of eligible retired teachers. The State presently provides 100% payment of group accident and sickness or health insurance on behalf of state employees. This bill provides parity between retired teachers and retired state employees by increasing the percentage of state payment of health insurance for retired teachers from 15% to 100%.

State retirees who meet statutory criteria have been covered under the state health insurance plan for many years. An increasing number have been required to enroll under Medicare in recent years. This has resulted in less coverage for these retirees because the Medicare plan has greater out-of-pocket expenses. This bill requires the State to pay Medicare premiums and provide supplemental insurance to equalize Medicare benefits with the state plan.
