All Adopted Amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action is listed to the right of the title. If final House and Senate action differ, both are listed. Committee Reports and Floor Action are abbreviated as follows:

LD 1306 An Act to Permit Private Educational Institutions of Higher Learning to Make Purchases through the State Purchasing ONTP

LD 1306 proposed that all institutions of higher education located in Maine be authorized to make purchases through the State. Currently, only the University of Maine System has this authority which it has rarely used.

The bill failed committee approval partly because of the appropriation that would be required, roughly \$53,500 over the biennium. In addition, many educational institutions have their own purchasing departments that purchase in quantities.

LD 1338 An Act to Improve Public Access to Public Hearing Records of the Department of Environmental Protection and the Board of Environmental Protection

SUMMARY

LD 1338 proposed that the DEP, within 24 hours following a hearing of the DEP or the Board, transcribe the hearing on computer disks which would be made available to the public at cost.

The bill failed Committee approval partly because the bill applied only to the Department of Environmental Protection. In addition, many agencies contract with private firms for records of testimony and transcriptions. Copies of transcriptions can be secured from these firms. The State has inadequate capability of reproducing tapes of meetings.

LD 1377 An Act to Regulate Child Support Enforcement by the Department of Human Services

LD 1377 proposed:

- A. To reduce from 6 years to 5 years, the period for which a parent is obligated for payment of past child support;
- B. To create the Office of Child Support Intermediary Services within the Executive Department to be autonomous from other state agencies;
- C. That the office director be appointed by the Governor, subject to review by the Legislative Committee on Human Resources and to confirmation by the Senate.

The bill failed to give the director of the office the necessary authority to implement the provisions of the bill. Other bills dealing with children were before the committee, and LD 1377 could be incorporated into a bill selected by the committee. In addition, the biennial appropriation required would have been roughly \$550,000.

SUMMARY

LD 1394 proposed that the 5 executive directors of the regional alcohol and drug abuse councils be included as members of the Maine Council on Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention and Treatment.

The Committee Amendment removed the ceiling figure of 5 executive directors and authorized the executive directors to appoint designees to represent them on the Council. Senate Amendment "A" increased the number of council members from 25 to 30.

SUMMARY

LD 1404 proposed that when state agencies hire classified employees through the use of registers of eligible applicants the hiring agency will receive the entire list of applicants and not a list limited to 6 names.

The bill failed to receive Committee approval for several reasons. For some job classifications, an entire list of applicants could include hundreds of names. The bureau of Human Resources is in the process of decentralizing hiring for many agencies and allowing many agencies to use direct hire procedures.
