The purpose of this bill was to increase legislative oversight of teacher and administrator certification issues and would have required the State Board of Education to report to the Joint Standing Committee on Education twice a year on the progress of a study and review currently being undertaken by the board.

SUMMARY

This resolve would have established the Commission to Study the Provision of Services by Schools for Students Leaving Substance Abuse Centers. The commission would have studied the need for and desirability of the establishment in schools of more formalized aftercare programs for students leaving formal substance abuse treatment programs. In conducting the study, the commission would have examined the following:

- 1. the number of Maine students returning to school after leaving a formal substance abuse treatment center;
- the recidivism rate for adolescents who return to school after attending substance abuse treatment programs;
- 3. existing aftercare programs in Maine schools;
- 4. whether academic credit should be given for participation in aftercare programs;
- 5. how issues of confidentiality are dealt with in providing aftercare in schools.

The membership would have included representatives of the Maine School Management Association, the Maine Teachers Association, adolescents recovering from substance abuse, providers of adolescent substance abuse treatment services, the public and the Legislature. The commission would have presented a written report of its findings and any recommended legislation the the Second Regular Session of the 114th Legislature no later than December 1, 1989.

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
