SUMMARY

This resolve would have established the Commission to Study Alternative Education. The Commission would be composed of 10 members: 3 members of the Education Committee, and representatives, to be appointed by the governor, of groups representing elementary school principals, secondary school principals, school management, teachers, school boards and home schools. The commission would look at issues concerning alternative instruction, including methods of determining student and teacher proficiency, instructor supervision, overall responsibility for instruction, funding, home schooling and issues of liability.

SUMMARY

This resolve would have directed the Board of Trustees of the University of Maine System to conduct a study to determine the costs of establishing an advanced degree program for nurse practitioners in northern Maine as well as the feasibility of establishing a nursing research center. The board would have reported its findings, including the costs of the nursing degree program and the proposed locations of the nursing degree program and research center, to the Legislature by February 1, 1990. This resolve was the result of the Commission to Study the Status of Nursing Professions in Maine.
