An Act to Exempt Shooting Ranges from Noise Control **Standards**

SUMMARY

This bill would have exempted firearm ranges from the new noise regulations under site location of development laws, provided that they are currently in compliance and are out of range of permanent dwellings, within a properly constructed sound-absorbing building or in compliance with local zoning. However, new noise regulations proposed by the Department of Environmental Protection are better suited to addressing noise problems from shooting ranges than the old regulations. The committee voted not to pass the bill.

SUMMARY

This bill proposed to regulate boaters on Sebago Lake. Section 1 of this bill established a program for sealing holding tanks except during pump-out at authorized dumping stations. Section 2 of the bill stiffened the penalties for discharging waste from a watercraft into Sebago Lake by prohibiting the watercraft operator from placing or operating a watercraft on inland waters for 2 years.

The committee amendment requires all watercraft operating on inland waters to have all wastewater generated from any sink, shower or toilet within the boat go directly into a holding tank. The holding tank in turn, must not be connected to any through-hull fittings. This bill takes effect April 1, 1990.

This bill would have required the Department of Environmental Protection to license any facility or person storing, treating, transporting or disposing of medical wastes. The Department would have been directed to adopt rules for the management of these requirements. The committee voted not to pass the bill in light of its earlier passage of LD 692.
