SUMMARY

The bill would make it a Class C crime to interfere with a publicly-owned dog.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-487) replaced the text of the bill. It makes it a Class C crime to kill, mutilate or permanently disable a dog certified for law enforcement use, and a Class D crime to otherwise interfere with a dog certified for law enforcement use.

House Amendment "A" to Committee Amendment "A" (H-570) makes a technical correction and inserts a knowledge requirement.
