#### SUMMARY

This bill was carried over from the First Regular Session.

This bill would have required the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation to conduct a systems study of the population to be served; to develop mechanisms to ensure cooperation and communication between inpatient units and community service providers; and to conduct a statewide assessment of the need for psychiatric inpatient units in local community hospitals. This bill would have put into effect 3 of the recommendations made by the Commission to Review Overcrowding at the Augusta Mental Health Institute and the Bangor Mental Health Institute.

#### SUMMARY

This bill was carried over from the First Regular Session.

This bill would revise the Medical Examiner Act. It provides that contents of written or recorded conversations evidencing suicidal intent will not be accessible to the general public. It raises medical examiner fees, restricts medical examiner involvement in cases involving long-term exposure to occupational and environmental toxins and alcohol and establishes a procedure for accumulation and preservation of records relating to missing persons.

The Committee Amendment narrows the focus of the procedure for missing persons and adds an appropriation.

The House Amendment clarifies the immunity language for persons providing information to the medical examiner.

### **SUMMARY**

This bill contains the minority recommendations of the Commission to Study the Status of Nursing Professions in Maine. It is similar to LD 1324 except in the following ways:

It restricts loans under the Maine Choice Program to nursing students. It does not extend the Health Occupations Training Program to health care workers other than nurses. It does not permit delegation of CNA supervision to LPNs. It does not require the Maine Health Policy Advisory Commission to monitor the recommendations of the Commission and it does not require the establishment of a nursing and practice center.

Committee Amendment "A" replaces the original bill. It creates an advisory group within the State Board of Nursing to study career mobility issues in nursing. It also increases the nursing license and renewal fees which are charged by the Board of Nursing. The amendment adds an emergency clause to the bill.

#### SUMMARY

This bill was carried over from the First Regular Session.

This bill would have established specific standards of care for the treatment of Maine's mentally ill citizens. The bill would have required the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation to put the standards into place, to report on progress toward compliance with the standards, to review the needs of all residents who have lived at a state institution for more than 60 days and to conduct an annual review of unmet patients needs. The bill would have funded staff and facility improvements at the Augusta Mental Health Institute and the Bangor Mental Health Institute.

### SUMMARY

This bill was carried over from the First Regular Session.

This original bill would have established the Maine Family Development Foundation as a private nonprofit corporation for the purpose of preventing child disabilities by promoting education, research, studies and public-private partnerships.

The Committee Amendment provides for the transfer of the Maine Children's Trust Fund to the Foundation and the dissolution of the Board of the Trust Fund when assets of the Foundation reach \$200,000.
