All Adopted Amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action is listed to the right of the title. If final House and Senate action differ, both are listed. Committee Reports and Floor Action are abbreviated as follows:

SUMMARY

This bill would have have increased the state share of municipal landfill cleanup and closure costs to 100%. The committee voted not to pass the bill. (See also LD 1457).

SUMMARY

This bill as amended by the committee (S-243) requires all municipal or quasi-municipal wastewater treatment facilities to accept sanitary waste from marinas. Section 2 requires that coastal marinas provide sewage pump-out facilities for watercraft with sanitary waste holding tanks. A House amendment (H-511) allows marinas to contract to provide these services.

SUMMARY

This resolve authorizes and directs the Director of the Bureau of Public Lands to convey a parcel of land in Augusta to the Maine Veterans' Homes. The Maine Veterans' Home in Augusta is located on that parcel. The Legislature has authorized the construction of 2 additional veterans' homes in Maine, one in Aroostook County and one in southern Maine. The Maine Veterans' Homes has recently received title to a parcel of land in Scarborough and has broken ground for the construction of the southern Maine veterans' home at the site. However, the deed to the property in Scarborough provides for a reverter back to the town in the event the facility ceases to be used as a veterans' home. Because the construction of both facilities will be financed through the issuance of Maine Veterans' Homes revenue bonds, it is necessary to provide adequate security for the bondholders.

The purpose of the conveyance authorized by this resolve is to permit the Maine Veterans' Homes to offer the Maine Veterans' Home in Augusta as security for the issuance of bonds to finance construction of the veterans' homes in Aroostook County and in southern Maine. Title to the property in Augusta, on which the Maine Veterans' Home presently sits, will revert back to the State when the bonds have been successfully paid off, if the bondholders do not foreclose upon or otherwise realize against the parcel as collateral for the bonds, and, at that time, the Maine Veterans' Home in Augusta will once again lease the parcel from the Bureau of Public Lands on the same terms as its current lease.

A Senate amendment (S-208) added a fiscal note to the bill.
