SUMMARY

LD 1666 was a carry over bill from the First Regular Session of the One Hundred and Fourteenth Legislature.

During the Second Regular Session of the One Hundred and Fourteenth Legislature, LD 1666 was further amended by the State and Local Government Committee and by both Houses of the Legislature. During the Session, several amendments to the bill were adopted, although all but one were removed prior to the bill's enactment. Amendments adopted and later removed from the bill during the Second Regular Session were Committee Amendment "C" (H-820), House Amendment "A" (H-1008), and Senate Amendment "B" (S-538). The enacted version of LD 1666 includes only House Amendment "A" (H-1130), which replaces the original

House Amendment "A" (H-1130) to LD 1666 establishes a Department of Children and Families within the Executive branch. The department is to be operational by July 1, 1991. The amendment also establishes an Interim Administrative Division and an Interim Commissioner of Children and Families within the Executive branch, a Maine Advisory Commission on Children and Families and a Joint Select Committee on Children and Families. The Interim Administrative Division and the Interim Commissioner must assist the Maine Advisory Commission and the Joint Select Committee in developing a plan to consolidate the delivery of services to children and families within the Department of Children and Families. The implementation plan must be submitted to the Legislature and the Governor by February 1, 1991.
