The bill required that owners or keepers of dogs used for hunting, training or exhibition in this State must produce proof of a rabies vaccination administered in this State or another state within 24 hours of request by a humane agent, animal control officer or law enforcement officer.

SUMMARY

The bill amended the agricultural marketing and bargaining laws as they applied to the sale of potatoes.

The committee amendment replaced the original bill and amended existing law to allow negotiation between parties subject to the Agricultural Marketing and Bargaining Act after an arbitrator has reached a decision. The act took effect when approved and will be repealed effective January 1, 1990. A legislative study of the agricultural marketing and bargaining law was established by the Legislative Council.

SUMMARY

The bill raised various license fees administered by the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources, Division of Regulations. The Committee requested the bill be carried over so affected parties might be represented and so the increased revenues could be retained for food inspector salary increases.
