

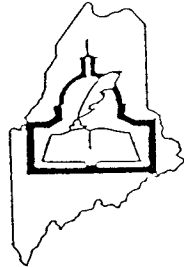

All Adopted Amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action is listed to the right of the title. Committee Reports and Floor Action are abbreviated as follows:

SUMMARY

This bill exempts locksmiths from the laws regulating security guards by amending the definition of "security guard" found at 32 MRSA §9403, sub-§9.

Committee Amendment "A" provides that a locksmith actually employed as a security guard by or doing business as a contract security company is subject to the law regulating security guards.

SUMMARY

This bill clarifies that the person who establishes a mortuary trust, the payor, may serve as a cotrustee of that trust along with the payee, typically a funeral home operator, who is statutorily required to be a trustee of the mortuary trust.
