

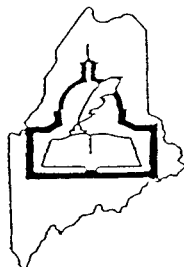

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The summaries are arranged by LD number for each committee.

All Adopted Amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action is listed to the right of the title. Committee Reports and Floor Action are abbreviated as follows:

OTP	Ought to Pass
OTP-ND	Ought to Pass in New Draft
OTP-ND-NT	Ought to Pass in New Draft, New Title
OTP-A	Ought to Pass as Amended
ONTP	Ought Not to Pass

LD 1833 An Act Relating to the Child and Family Services and Child Protection Act

SUMMARY

The bill amends the Child and Family Services and Child Protection Act by specifying that family reunification efforts must be made within a period of time which meets the needs of the children involved.

This bill was one of four bills relating to child protective services considered by a subcommittee composed of members of both the Human Resources and the Judiciary Committee. See also LDs 2115, 2199 and 2227.

SUMMARY

This bill extends the reporting date for the Systems Assessment Commission from April 1, 1990 to December 15, 1990.

The Committee Amendment adds a provision carrying forward funds which had previously been appropriated for the Commission.

The Senate Amendments add a fiscal note and correct a reference to the State House and Capital Park Commission.

LD 1853 An Act to Facilitate the Admission and Treatment of Involuntary Patients by Community-based Mental Health Institutions

SUMMARY

The original bill would provide that, when receiving involuntarily committed patients pursuant to a contract with the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation, a nonstate facility would be treated as the State and employees of the facility would be treated as employees of the State for purposes of immunity and liability.

The Committee Amendment replaces the original bill and applies specified provisions of the Tort Claims Act to receiving facilities and their employees. It requires that those facilities guarantee the rights of patients and requires the State, within available resources, to reimburse facilities for certain start-up costs.

The Senate Amendment clarifies that the obligation of reimbursing facilities for start-up costs is limited to the available resources of the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation.

LD 1864 An Act Allowing Day Care Centers to Use Cloth Diapers PUBLIC 723

SUMMARY

The bill supercedes rules adopted by the Department of Human Services which prohibit the use of cloth diapers in day care facilities. The bill requires the rules to allow cloth diapers if a day care facility employs a diaper laundering service approved by the Department.

Committee Amendment "A" adds that the rules must require the laundering service to be endorsed by a national accrediting organization and must specify the type of diaper covers which must be used.

LD 1872 An Act Concerning Patient Access to Medical Records PUBLIC 666

SUMMARY

The bill limits the fees charged by physicians, surgeons and chiropractors for medical reports and copies of medical records to reasonable costs incurred.

Committee Amendment "A" replaces the original bill and limits the fees charged, by all health care practitioners, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 24, Section 2502, subsection 1-A for medical reports and copies of medical records.

LD 1875 An Act to Repeal Hospital Assessments Used to Fund State Programs PUBLIC 909

SUMMARY

The original bill repeals the hospital excise tax.

The Committee Amendment makes the repeal effective June 30, 1992.

The House Amendment adds a fiscal note.
