The bill transfers a new clerk position from the Administrative Court to the Administrative Office of the Courts. The new position was created by PL 1989, c. 526 which established liquor seller education requirements.

The original bill amended the anti-lapse section of the Probate Code to provide for distribution of estates on a per capita at each generation basis when a bequest is made to a person's issue.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-816) replaced the bill. It clarifies the bill's wording and places the change in the section of the Probate Code which defines other generic terms.
