2. Reduced the threshold number of employees from 250 to 50;
3. Permitted the Bureau of Labor Standards to contract with private parties to conduct the inspection and further provided that all costs of the inspection were to be paid by the facility operator; and
4. Made several other minor changes to the original LD.

Committee Amendment "C" was the minority report of the committee and provided for an inspection of a facility using hazardous substances when more than 1/2 of the employees who were assigned to handle those substances had worked in that capacity for less than 6 months. The inspection was coordinated by the Commissioner of Environmental Protection and was intended to determine compliance with existing legal requirements related to the use of hazardous substances.

SUMMARY

LD 1871 proposed to resolve workers' compensation apportionment claims by simply dividing liability on a pro rata basis among the various insurers or employers. It also prevented any reapportionment if the later injury occurred more than 2 years after an earlier injury for which apportionment would otherwise be due.

SUMMARY

LD 1880 proposed to increase the workers' compensation burial allowance from "up to \$1,000" to "up to \$5,000" and also increase the incidental compensation paid as a result of an employee's death from \$1,000 to \$25,000.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-786) increased the burial allowance to a maximum of \$4,000 and increased the incidental compensation to \$3,000. It also provided that the burial reimbursement would be paid to the person responsible for the funeral costs and the incidental compensation would be paid to the employee's estate.
