SUMMARY

LD 1942 clarified the status of employees of a professional corporation for workers' compensation purposes. These employees will be subject to the Workers' Compensation Act unless they affirmatively decide not to be covered and so notify the chair of the Workers' Compensation Commission.

Committee Amendment "A" (S-526) made technical drafting corrections to the bill.

SUMMARY

LD 1947 proposed to require employers to negotiate with an employee to establish a method of repaying any overcompensation accidentally paid to the employee.

Committee Amendment "A" (S-524) replaced the bill and prevents an employer from unilaterally withholding more than 10% of an employee's net pay in order to recover any overcompensation unknowingly accepted by the employee.

House Amendment "B" (H-890) to Committee Amendment "A" clarifies that the LD does not limit any other civil remedies available to an employer and clarifies that when the amount of overcompensation is less than 15% of the correct pay, the employer has the burden of showing by clear and convincing evidence that the employee knowingly accepted the overcompensation.

SUMMARY

LD 1972 clarifies that certificates of authorization provided by an employee to allow his employer access to his medical records for workers' compensation purposes are valid for as long as the claim persists.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-777) added a fiscal note to the bill.
