SUMMARY

LD 2044 proposed to amend the Constitution of Maine to authorize the Legislature to allow the current use valuation of waterfront property used exclusively for marine-related industries. The Maine Constitution allows current use valuation of farm and agricultural lands, timberlands and woodlands, recreational open space and lands used for game management or wildlife sanctuary.

Although the Committee supported the concept of property tax relief for commercial fishermen, several substantive taxation issues prevented the Committee from reaching consensus on LD 2044. These included:

- 1. A concern that the definition of the type of property affected by the bill was too broad, and that a more closely written definition was needed;
- 2. A concern that the impact of the bill on the local property tax bases of coastal Maine communities was essentially unknown. The Committee felt that those costs could be substantial and that they should be estimated beforehand; and
