**SUMMARY** 

This bill prohibits the sale of bait or baitfish in polystyrene foam containers.

The committee amendment (H-729) delays the effective date of this requirement to January 1, 1991, to give bait dealers time to come into compliance.

SUMMARY

This bill, as amended by the committee (H-749), removes the requirement that the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission directly notify every affected landowner of changes in zoning boundaries when there are more than 50 landowners. Instead, if there are more than 50 landowners affected by a proposed change, the commission must publish public notice in a newspaper that circulates in the area. The committee amendment also adds an emergency preamble, emergency clause and fiscal note.

#### **SUMMARY**

This bill allows municipalities bordering coastal harbors and estuaries to form watershed districts. The committee amendment (H-751) allows all administrative matters for coastal watershed districts to be handled consistent with the administration of watershed districts. Additional trustees, representing sanitary and sewer districts, also are allowed.

The amendment also requires a coastal watershed district to resolve any jurisdictional problems with any existing watershed districts prior to formation.

The Senate amendment (S-722) requires the cost of any public hearing held by the Department of Environmental Protection to discuss the formation of a coastal watershed district to be paid by the applicants.
