SUMMARY

The bill made conspiracy to traffic in prison contraband a Class C crime, and attempting to traffic in prison contraband a Class C crime.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-846) replaced the bill. It deletes the inclusion in the definition of prison contraband those items designated by regulation as contraband. It also makes attempting to traffick the same class as trafficking (Class C).

The bill amended the law governing disclosure proceedings after a money judgment to prohibit debt collectors from requiring debtors to travel great distances for disclosure hearings.

Committee Amendment "A" (S-492) requires creditors to schedule the asset disclosure hearing for a consumer debt either where the debtor lives or where the transaction took place.

SUMMARY

The bill, modeled on the Nebraska law, provided procedures for grandparents to petition the court for visitation rights regarding their grandchildren in specific situations.

Grandparents' rights is the subject matter of an OPLA research project approved by the Legislative Council.
