This bill requires the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation to draft rules to extend the rights of persons with mental retardation to all clients of the Bureau of Mental Retardation and to submit legislation to the 115th Legislature to provide the funding to enable adoption of the rules.

The Committee Amendment replaced the language of the original bill and added a fiscal note which states that the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation will use existing staff and resources to carry out this resolve.

The bill requires that an informational brochure regarding fetal alcohol syndrome, provided by the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation, be given to both parties when a couple applies for a marriage license.

SUMMARY

The bill grants to the Department of Human Services access to hospital and physician data which is filed with other agencies for the purpose of conducting chronic disease or data quality investigations. The bill protects physicians and hospitals from civil damages which result from the investigations.

Committee Amendment "A" amends statutes regarding the Health Care Finance Commission to enable the Commission to comply with the bill's provisions. It also extends the bill's immunity provisions to include the employees of hospitals and physicians, and requires the Department of Human Services to adopt rules regarding the use of data and reimbursement of physicians and hospitals.

Office of Policy and Legal Analysis

House Amendment "A" to Committee Amendment "A" amends the fiscal note to clarify that the Department will absorb reimbursement within its existing resources.

SUMMARY

This bill would have required that no more than 1/2 of a couple's income or the income of the applicant spouse, whichever is less, be considered available to an institutionalized spouse for purposes of the Medicaid program. The bill would also have extended the spousal impoverishment provisions of the federal Medicare Catastrophic Coverage Act of 1988 to persons receiving nursing home-level care at home under the Medicaid waiver program.
