SUMMARY

This bill would have repealed an exemption from the existing ban on the large-scale, commercial transportation of water between towns. The exemption in question currently allows the continued commercial transportation of water that is subsequently bottled as a beverage when the activity predates July 1, 1987.

SUMMARY

This bill would have subjected waste-to-energy incineration facilities to rate regulation by the Public Utility Commission. The Commission would have regulated waste disposal rates and sales of electricity and heat. Facilities burning less than 2% solid waste (as a fraction of total fuel) would have been exempt. The bill would also have required regulatory review of such facilities under the site location of development laws administered by the Department of Environmental Protection.

SUMMARY

This bill, as amended by the committee (H-799), exempts all residential developments and daytime construction activity of commercial or industrial developments from noise regulation by the Department of Environmental Protection under the site location of development law.
