An Act to Require the State to Pay a Portion of the Health Insurance Premiums for Dependents of Retired State Employees LV/WD

SUMMARY

Currently, the law requires that the State pay 100% of only active and retired employees' share of health insurance premiums. No provision is made for dependent coverage, except that the State pays 50% of the premiums of Legislators' dependents. Through collective bargaining, however, the State is required to pay 60% of dependents' medical, but not dental, premiums for active employees.

This bill requires the State to pay a portion of the health insurance premiums for dependents of retired state employees that is equal to the portion of those premiums which are currently paid for dependents of active employees through the collective bargaining agreement.

SUMMARY

This bill makes the following changes to the laws governing the Maine Committee on Aging:

- 1. Strikes out the provision that the Committee is solely advisory.
- 2. Empowers the Committee to investigate complaints made by individuals receiving care under any one of a number of government programs.
- 3. Allows staff and volunteers, in addition to Committee members, to enter the premises of programs receiving governmental funding.
- 4. Requires that ombudsmen be trained or supervised by Committee staff.

Committee Amendment "A" accomplishes the following:

- 1. Committee Amendment "A" retains the provision that the functions of the Maine Committee on Aging are solely advisory.
- 2. The amendment adds staff and volunteers to those individuals connected with the committee who must abide by the federal law regarding conflict of interest, as required by the original bill.
- 3. The amendment requires that the Director of the Bureau of Elder and Adult Services act as liaison between that bureau and the committee.
- 4. The amendment adds to the reports required from the committee those requested by the Governor or the Legislature and requires that the committee's long-term care ombudsman program submit reports as required by the bureau.
