An Act to Facilitate the Disclosure of the Mobile Home Statutory Warranty PUBLIC 717

SUMMARY

This bill clarifies that the State's new mobile home warranty is a statutory warranty providing rights and duties in addition to those created by other statutes. The bill requires the Manufactured Housing Board, in consultation with the Attorney General, to develop a written form warranty and distribute that form to dealers and manufacturers who in turn are required to provide the purchaser of a new mobile home with a copy of the form warranty.

Committee Amendment "A" clarifies that warranty form must be fully consistent with the terms of the new mobile home warranty law, 14 MRSA §1404, and adds a fiscal note.

An Act to Establish Mediation for Mobile Home Park Operators and Tenants (Reported Pursuant to P & S Law 1987, chapter 139)

SUMMARY

This bill, a minority recommendation of the Commission on Manufactured Housing established by P&S 1987 c. 139, establishes a system for mediation of disputes between mobile home park owners and tenants regarding changes in park rules, rent increases and evictions. The bill includes a January 1, 1992 sunset.

An Act to Improve Drinking Water Quality in Mobile Home Parks (Reported Pursuant to P & S Law 1987, chapter 139) LV/WD

SUMMARY

This bill requires a mobile home park owner to notify prospective tenants of drinking water complaints if the owner receives written notification that 25% or more of the park's tenants find the park-provided water objectionable. The bill also requires the Department of Human Services, Bureau of Health, to study the costs and technical feasibility of developing secondary drinking water standards for color, odor and taste.
