#### SUMMARY

This bill, as amended by the committee (H-1082), proposed to reduce the use of toxic or hazardous materials and reduce the production of hazardous waste. Provisions of this bill were substantially similar to those enacted in LD 2507.

#### SUMMARY

This bill amends the statutory criteria governing the qualifications of members to the Citizens' Forestry Advisory Council. The bill provides additional guidance for appointing members to assure that a balanced representation of views and interests is provided. The bill also repeals a provision which previously limited the number of council members who were employees of an entity with a financial interest in the forest resource.

#### **SUMMARY**

Under the original bill, a person would have been able to commence a civil suit for injunctive relief against any person, including the State or any of its subdivisions, for an alleged violation of the local shoreland zoning ordinance or violation of other local land use laws that regulate a lake watershed.

The bill, as amended by the committee (S-535), allows only water utilities to sue for injunctive relief in shoreland zoning violations. Several other requirements of the original bill are strengthened:

- 1. The prohibition on bringing a suit is expanded to include those instances in which a municipality is pursuing the violation;
- 2. A water utility commencing a civil action must notify the Department of Environmental Protection
