

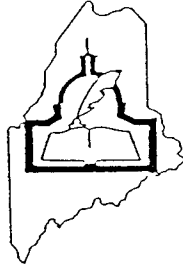

SUMMARY

This bill, as amended by the committee (H-811), establishes the Maine Coast Environmental Trust Fund and incorporates the administration of the fund into the duties of the Marine Research Board. To effect this change, the board is expanded to include an additional representative of an environmental organization and a public member. A reporting deadline for the Marine Research Board is delayed. In awarding grants under the marine research grants program, oversight of the board by the Maine Science and Technology Commission is added to avoid potential conflict-of-interest situations.

The purpose of the fund is to provide a vehicle for individuals or foundations to provide grant monies or for the courts to award judgments for marine research. A provision in the original bill for a percentage of environmental penalties to go into the trust is removed. Executive agencies are eligible for grants from the fund if they are undertaking a research proposal with another entity that is not an executive agency.

The Senate amendment (S-728) clarifies that General Fund appropriations will not be required to fund the grants program of the Maine Coast Environmental Trust Fund.
