This bill amends the registration requirements contained in the lobbyist disclosure procedures. Organizations are required to provide more information on number and residency of members, on monies received and on expenditures made for the purpose of influencing legislation.

SUMMARY

This bill allows the director of the State Lottery Commission to enter into a written agreement with the Multi-State Lottery Commission, known as Lotto*America, for the purpose of operating, marketing and promoting a joint lottery game.

Committee Amendment "A", the minority report, adds a fiscal note.

Senate Amendment "B" places a 3-year sunset of the Lottery Commission's authorization to participate in Lotto*America.

Senate Amendment "D" requires the Lottery Commission to hold a public hearing prior to entering an agreement to participate in Lotto*America.

SUMMARY

This bill limits the liability of contractors that undertake work to close municipal solid waste landfills in accordance with a plan approved by the Department of Environmental Protection.

Committee Amendment "A" clarifies that a contractor remains liable under criminal laws and under workers' compensation laws and makes DEP's issuance of grant funds for closure work contingent on proof by the municipality that the contractor that will do the closure work has workers' compensation insurance or is
