#### SUMMARY

LD 2248 prohibited municipal transits districts from selling any goods or services to any other entity except other transit districts, unless those goods or services were either essential to the purchaser or not available from another source. The intent of this bill was to limit the ability of transit districts to compete with private enterprise. Violations of these provisions were held as a Class E crime.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-832) to LD 2248 moderated the prohibition by allowing municipal transit districts to sell, rent or lease to municipalities and quasi-municipal corporations, as well as other transit districts, and by exempting advertising space on transit owned vehicles and existing vacant office or storage space owned by the transit district from the prohibition. Transit districts regulated by the Public Utilities Commission under Title 35-A, Part 5, were also exempted from the prohibition. In addition, the amendment changed the penalty from a Class E crime to a civil penalty not to exceed \$5,000.

House Amendment "A" (H-856) to Committee Amendment "A" modified the prohibition further, by extending permission to transit districts to sell, rent or lease services to the State.

### SUMMARY

LD 2254 implements the recommendations of the Special Commission to Study the Organization of the State's Cultural Agencies by changing the existing structure of the state's cultural service agencies and

programs. The bill establishes a new "Maine State Cultural Affairs Council" and transfers to the Council all oversight responsibility for the State's four cultural service agencies: the Maine Historic Preservation Commission; the Maine Arts Commission; the Maine Museum Commission; and the Maine Library Commission. Administrative responsibility for those agencies previously fell within the Department of Education and Cultural Services. The bill also changes the name of the Department of Education and Cultural Services to the Department of Education.

Committee Amendment "A" (S-546) to LD 2254 places the library media responsibilities under the Commissioner of Education and requires that the Governor appoint the chair of the Maine Cultural Affairs Council from among the members of the four commissions.

## **SUMMARY**

LD 2277 requires that the Bureau of Public Improvements adopt rules governing the acquisition of goods and services by the State through the competitive bidding process and the appeals procedure for aggrieved persons. The bill establishes standards governing the appeals procedure, including the right of an aggrieved person to request a stay of a contract award decision and to request an appeals hearing. Rules governing competitive bidding and the appeals procedure must be adopted by January 1, 1990.

House amendment "A" (S-571) to LD 2277 clarified the intent of the bill in several areas and changed the Appeals Board appointing authority from the State Controller to the Commissioner of Finance.

Senate Amendment "A" (S-576) to LD 2277 was a technical amendment offered by the Committee on Bills in the Second Reading which inserted 2 subsections that were inadvertently omitted from the bill.

LD 2299 An Act to Require That Relevant Experience Be a Consideration in Selecting Members of the State Employee Health Commission (Reported Pursuant to a Study Authorized by the Legislative Council)

#### **SUMMARY**

LD 2299 requires that members of the State Employee Health Insurance Commission appointed after September 1, 1990 must have experience that is relevant to the responsibility of the Commission. The Commission members serve as trustees of the state employee accident and health insurance program and as advisors to the program director on heath insurance issues.
