

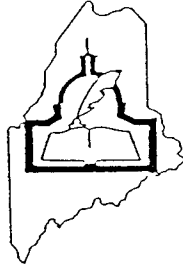

This bill, as amended by the committee (H-882), requires a person buying stumpage to provide a landowner with accurate information on the stumpage cut and sold off their land.

**SUMMARY**

This was one of 8 bills containing the recommendations of the Commission on Maine's Future. This resolve would have established the Maine Commission on Environmental Policy. The new commission would have been directed to study and consolidate existing state environmental policies into a comprehensive body of policy that recognizes the cumulative effects of changes to the environment on Maine's quality of life, define minimum standards for responsible individual, governmental and corporate activity, and incorporate, on a continuing basis, the environmental policy values of the people of Maine. The bill was withdrawn to be presented as part of a comprehensive package next year.
