plan, which is responsible for the distribution of telecommunications equipment. It includes speech impaired persons within the purview of this program. It replaces the term "teletypewriter equipment" with "special telecommunications devices" to reflect that the Department of Human Services distributes more than teletypewriters under this program. It terminates the Department of Human Services' responsibility for a telecommunications relay service at the time another provider provides the same or similar telecommunications relay service.

- 2. It anticipates the development of a statewide telecommunications relay service for the dear, hearing impaired and speech impaired and articulates the features of such a system in Title 35-A.
- 3. It creates an 11-member Telecommunications Relay Services Advisory Council to evaluate telecommunications relay service in this State and to advise providers of those services regarding telecommunications relay service matters.
- 4. In order to accomplish a smooth transition without an interruption in service from the state-administered telecommunications relay service provided pursuant to Title 22, chapter 961, to a service regulated under Title 35-A, it requires the Public Utilities Commission to periodically notify the Department of Human Services, Division of Deafness, of the development and implementation of any telecommunications relay services. It is anticipated that the statewide service will be operational on or before January 1, 1991.
- 5. Enactment of this bill was not intended to favor any particular provider of telecommunications relay services.

The title was amended to reflect the changes in the committee amendment.
