SUMMARY

The bill would increase the authority of Maine DOT to lease, purchase and dispose of "railroad operating equipment" by repealing a provision which restricts that to freight cars. The bill would authorize the use of state funds for that purpose. Present law prohibits the use of state funds. The bill would authorize financial assistance to "short line operators" which have gross annual revenues less than \$5 million or operate over less than 100 miles of track.

The committee amendment (H-921) adds a fiscal note that existing funds would be used.

SUMMARY

The Resolve would designate the Quoddy Loop Scenic Way. The Quoddy Loop is a region of eastern Washington County Maine and southern Charlotte County New Brunswick which includes Cobscook Bay, Passamaquoddy Bay, the islands of Deer Island, Grand Manan, and Campobello, and the coastline from St. Stephen to Lepreau in Canada. The area is served by a network of roads and ferry service including Route I from Machias to Calais, Baileyville, Princeton, and Canadian Route I from St. Stephen to Lepreau. The resolve takes effect when similar legislation takes effect in New Brunswick.

This bill allows dealers to loan vehicles to municipal police departments and attach municipal registration plates to the vehicles for law enforcement purposes.
